**PRE ENTRY IS REQUIRED. SEE #3 BELOW**

1. Competition is open to all amateurs. Garden Club affiliation is not required.
2. The use of plant materials in any division of the show must conform to the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation list.
3. **All exhibitors must submit at least one walk in or mail in entry, (see top of page) or an online entry in order to be eligible to submit additional entries. All exhibits must be in place by 4 PM on Sunday August 11.**
4. Standard Systems of Awarding will be used and awards given only when merited. Decisions of the certified judges will be final.
5. Building will be open to the public at 10 AM Tuesday, August 13. Building will be open for removing exhibits Monday, August 19, from 2 to 6 PM. Exhibits must remain in place until then.
6. **Only one (1) entry in any one lot.**
7. **NO ARTIFICIAL FLOWERS, FOLIAGE OR FRUIT WILL BE PERMITTED.**
8. Any lot in Horticulture may be subdivided if the number of exhibits warrants and exhibits will be judged in newly formed subdivision.
9. Horticulture specimens must have been grown by the exhibitor and potted plants been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least 45 days.
10. Flower pots must be clean.
11. Cut specimens must be in bloom. (Containers will be provided.)

12. Correctly-named specimens will be given preference by judges.
13. Exhibitors must consult the Classification Chairman before placing exhibit.
14. To win the top awards in Horticulture (Adult or Youth), the specimen must be named.
15. Youth exhibitors limited to children up to the age of 18. **NO ENTRY FEE.**
16. Reasonable supervision will be maintained at all times; but the Fair Board of Directors, the Committee and the sponsors cannot be responsible for exhibitor's property.
17. **EXHIBITORS AND SPECTATORS ARE PROHIBITED FROM BRINGING ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ONTO THE FAIRGROUNDS. ANYONE IN VIOLATION OF THIS MAY BE ASKED TO LEAVE, FORFEIT THEIR PREMIUMS AND/OR MAY BE REFUSED FUTURE PARTICIPATION IN THE FAIR.**

**Lot 5—Tea Party**

Use garden flowers, grasses, wildflowers, or foliage to reflect this year’s theme in a table setting for today’s casual style of entertaining. Entrants provide the card table, cloth, place settings and floral arrangement. The entire arrangement will be judged.

Choose your favorite aspect of the Fair as your interpretation vehicle for a floral design of any size or proportion. The base/container should complement the theme of the design. Please submit a list of materials used to be displayed with the arrangement.
