IMPORTANT ENTRY INFORMATION

MAIL/HAND DELIVERY DEADLINE
JULY 31, 2010 - 5 PM

ON LINE ENTRY DEADLINE
AUGUST 7, 2010 - midnight

It is the exhibitor's responsibility to make sure the entry form is received in the Fair Office before the deadline.
NO EXCEPTIONS.

1. Before making entries, read **General Rules and Regulations, Standards for Conduct of Fairs, Animal Health Requirements, and IAFE National Show Ring Code of Ethics.**
 2. "Open" means any size pony, any age exhibitor.
 3. Juniors are 17 & under. Juniors who turn age 18 **after** January 1, 2010 must stay in junior lots and may not show in adult lots. Juniors cannot show stallions over one year of age.
 4. No bathing of ponies around the pony barns.
 5. Ponies not permitted outside without a handler, who must be an exhibitor or owner. Ponies are not permitted outside pony area unless they are showing in the main ring.
 6. For the purpose of safety, the Superintendent reserves the right to disqualify or remove from the exhibit, grounds and ring any pony that is unruly or mismanaged. The judge's decision is final in all lots. Any exhibitor who shows disrespect for the judge or who displays poor sportsmanship will be disqualified from the show.
 7. **Schooling of any kind from the ringside is prohibited once the judge has begun the Lot. Any exhibitor who is being schooled from the ringside during the Lot will be disqualified.**
 8. Time limit between judging will be at the discretion of the judge.
 9. No sleeping or cooking in or near any pony or horse barn.
 10. Each exhibitor will supply his/her own feed and bedding. All ponies must be fed by 8:00 a.m. each day. Stalls are to be cleaned every day before 11:00 a.m. or you will lose your stall.
 11. Stable space is limited and will be assigned by Superintendent only. Please call 356-8167 for reservations. Limit of 2 stalls per immediate family (includes husband, wife and children 18 and under). Reservations accepted from owners only and you may not call to reserve a stall for anyone else.
- NOTICE: If you are considering participating in this Exhibit, you must reserve a stall or be put on the waiting list. Contact either Superintendent with any questions.**
- Exhibitors from 2009 confirming stall requests for 2010 must call either Superintendent by June 1, 2010. After June 1, stalls that are not confirmed will be reassigned. Requests for tack stall reservations should be sent to Rose Norkus at rose.norkus@altamontfair.com or 887-2489. Stall reservations**

for Departments R and W also must be requested through Rose Norkus. See the General Rules for details.

12. Name, section, rider/driver of pony must appear on entry form. **All exhibitors must make a separate entry for each pony/exhibitor combination.** (Example: If there are 5 exhibitors you must complete five entry forms.) Complete name and address of each exhibitor must accompany all entries. **Negative coggins testing and proof of rabies vaccination must accompany your submission to the Entry Office.** A photocopy of your entries must be sent to Lynne Baldauf, 429 Helderberg Trail, E. Berne, NY 12059.
13. Incomplete entries will be rejected.
14. Ponies cannot be left unattended in the pony ring, 15-minute turnout limit.
15. No substitution of ponies in performance or conformation lots. The exhibitor's name must be entered in Equitation, Leadline and Reinsmanship Lots.

16. No ponies will be allowed around or near the main show ring Tuesday or Sunday. These days are reserved for the Draft Horse Shows.
17. Absolutely no pony rides (free or otherwise) to the public. If you are caught giving pony rides, you will forfeit any premiums.
18. **All animal exhibits will close at 8 PM on Sunday. Release time will be 8:00 PM Sunday evening.**
19. There will be workdays to repair pony stalls prior to the opening of the Fair. All exhibitors are responsible for having their stalls ready for the Fair.
20. **WALK/TROT/JOG 10 AND UNDER** - Riders must be 10 and under.
21. **WALK/TROT/JOG 11-29** - Riders between the ages of 11 & 29 who are not at the cantering level, and have not cantered at any show.
22. **OVER THE HILL** Cannot go in any lot where a canter is required at any show.
23. **MAIDEN LOTS** - To be eligible, you must not have ever won a first place in that type of lot.
24. This is an exhibit and no commercial advertising will be permitted. No "for sale" signs and no monetary exchanges between exhibitor and owner for equine services performed at this Fair.
25. **All ponies must be in place by Monday August 16, 2010. Arrival time is 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Lights will be turned off at 9:00 p.m.**
26. There will be a meeting of all pony exhibitors 5:00 p.m. Monday, August 16, near the pony ring.

27. There will be a designated area for the parking of all livestock trailers. You will not be able to park them anywhere on the hill or along the fence line by the barns.

28. The gate near the pony barns will be open from 6:30 a.m. to 8:00 a.m.

29. PONY HEIGHT: Ponies in this exhibit shall be 14.2 hands or lower. One quarter inch will be allowed for shoes. No cards or paperwork will be accepted as measurements. Ponies must be measured by the pony superintendents.

ATTENTION HORSE AND PONY EXHIBITORS: Mounted horses will not be allowed in any walkway. To move your horse from its stall to the show area you must lead your horse to the track area and mount after you have entered the area designated for horses and horse exhibitors. Grooming, tacking, etc., must be done in your stall or in the designated area for horses and horse exhibitors only.

NOTICE: Measuring of ponies is mandatory. Contact either Superintendent in charge of this Department for scheduling.

NOTICE: Halter Lots are scheduled for Tuesday.
